CODE CRACKING WORKSHOP




Computer Science students explored the home of the code breakers at Bletchley Park heritage museum.

They discovered more about the secret D-Day role of Bletchley Park and its impact on World War Two, as well as significant developments made by Alan Turing, the pioneer of modern computing and the new face of the £50 note; the first time a computer scientist and LGBTQ+ person has been recognised in this way.

They also attended an Enigma code breaking workshop at the birth place of the GCHQ Government Communications Headquarters.

DIGITAL SKILLS ACADEMY

Our Digital Skills Academy at Leigh College has three state-of-the-art learning laboratories, each with equipment focusing on a specific digital specialism.



- The Internet of Things Laboratory has technology to integrate a range of devices and machines to solve problems, for example the development of smart home products like Alexa and Hive.
- The Cyber Security and Digital Technologies Laboratory is a hub for developing up-to-date software for websites and Cloud facilities.
- The Robotics and Artificial Intelligence Laboratory is where students build and programme robots to fulfil a range of activities. Equipment includes walking robots, with a six-legged spider robot, robotic arms and 3D AI software.
