you to read, write, study, and
increase your confidence.
You can read any on-screen text
out loud and improve your
assignment writing skills.
We have created a simple tutorial
that is available on the ALS VLE
page or can be found on
YouTube. There is also an
instruction guide which can be
found on our VLE page along with
lots of other fantastic tips and
guides.

We're going to continue talk about the cool things that ClaroRead can do in this month's edition of StudyHacks but if you would like more information about the software, you can contact our Enabling Technology Officer.

When you open ClaroRead a toolbar will show at the top of the screen. It's easy to figure out what each of the icons do, however we've listed a few examples below;



Play and Stop buttons

The Play button starts
ClaroRead and the Stop button
stops ClaroRead speaking.



Font button

The Font button allows you to select up to three pre-set fonts, increase or decrease font size, change the colour etc.



Spacing button

The Spacing button allows you to change the spacing between letters, lines and paragraphs for documents.



Homophones button

Homophones are words that sound alike but are different e.g. where, were and wear. This button helps you check if you have used the right one.



Check button

The Check button is used to access a spell checker, thesaurus and a separate homophone checker.



Predict button

The Predict button can be used when you know a few of the letters at the beginning of a word you want to spell and you want to try to spell it yourself.
