March	Once a student has had 3 lateral flow Covid tests through the College centre they will be issued with home testing kits to continue regular testing at home. The kits include comprehensive instructions but if there are any difficulties students should speak to their tutor or the head of studies team. It is essential that students register their test through the NHS link quoted in the pack and email their result inclusive of a screen shot of the NHS registration of test to College. Please include name and student number in the subject bar of the email to Covidappresults@wigan-leigh.ac.uk. If you have a positive test please stay at home and send a direct message on Teams to your personal tutor, a head of studies team member or head of department for further support and direction. Alternatively you can phone 01942 761600 and ask for a member of Heads of study. The government are encouraging whole household lateral flow testing and we recommend that you look on your local council website for home test collection pick up point information. The College continues to operate robust Covid safe systems including the wearing of masks, social distancing, hand sanitising, timetable adjustments to reduce mixing of groups etc	
25 th February	Return to College In line with Government guidance we are seeking to have a staged return to College from 8 th March 2021. Covid 19 Lateral Flow testing has been recommended. Initially this will be conducted within the College test site facilities and then twice weekly by students at home, albeit the College will maintain a centre as a supportive measure to be used according to need. Students will be invited to their first test prior to their first onsite class, which in some cases will be in advance of 8 th March or during their first period at College. Students will be advised by their tutor of the date of their return to class over the three week phased return plan period. Letters home, providing information about the testing procedure and associated details, will be sent out. Timetabled sessions will continue on-line throughout this period transitioning seamlessly to face to face teaching. Government Consultation concerning the award of Vocational technical Qualifications (VTQs) Open to parents, students, teachers from 15th to 29th January

This consultation covers the scope of qualifications and the approach to awarding qualifications in 2021.

The impact of this proposed approach for our students is broadly that written exams will be cancelled in most cases and the knowledge & academic aspect of courses will be primarily assessed through assignment work and will no longer include exams or written controlled assessments taken in College. However you will need to continue to complete work, undertake on-line tests and assignments set and marked by your teacher and moderated by awarding bodies during lockdown and when you return to College. This work and that already completed will count towards your final grade.

If you are taking a course that has a significant and important practical element, such as a construction trade (for example plumbing, plastering, brick, electrical installation), hairdressing, beauty, accountancy etc. then final exams that prove your competence will still be required and these may be delayed as in most cases you need to get back into College or possibly a work placement to be able to complete your learning before taking the assessment.

The College will be responding to the consultation and will update students and parents once specific details and this general direction of travel are confirmed

Pearson BTEC exams update:

As you may have heard, the DfE has announced today (PDF) that scheduled assessments vocational qualifications, will not take place in February and March. For students taking Pearson qualifications, this means that external assessments for BTEC Level 2 Tech Awards, Firsts, Technicals and Level 3 Nationals will not go ahead in February or March. While we welcome this decision, which aligns to the position for General Qualifications, and puts your safety first, we know that many of you will be disappointed, as you have been studying hard believing you would be able to take the assessments. We want to reassure you that we will put arrangements in place for those of you who are now unable to take your external assessments to ensure you are not disadvantaged, so that those of you expecting to complete your qualification this year will be able to progress. We understand that Ofqual will consult on arrangements for issuing grades this year for regulated Vocational and Technical Qualifications this.

Students please note that it is imperative you continue learning and attend all of your scheduled lessons. It is clear to the College that there will be robust arrangements in place for
