WHAT WILL I STUDY?

The **Level 1** course includes seven units on human growth and development, communication and healthy lifestyles. You will also study personal and social development, alongside English, maths and a work placement.

At **Level 2** you will study a range of modules including: communication; safeguarding; health and safety; and practical skills. You will also study a range of optional modules and English and maths at an appropriate level.

The **Level 3 BTEC** course is worth 180 credits, with core credits on: equality, diversity and rights; communication; health and safety; development through the life stages; anatomy and physiology; personal and professional development; sociological and psychological perspectives. You will also take maths and English at an appropriate level.

T Levels include work placements of minimum 45 days with a local health employer including Wrightington, Wigan and Leigh NHS Foundation Trust (WWL) over the two-year programme.

Your occupational specialism will cover specific aspects of adult, mental health or healthcare services, including physiological readings and how to care for service users in different settings and with different needs.

COURSE LENGTH

Levels 1 and 2 are full-time for one academic year. **Level 3** courses are full-time for two academic years.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Throughout the year by a range of methods, including assignments, presentations, group work and projects and scenario based roleplay.

WHAT CAN I PROGRESS TO?
